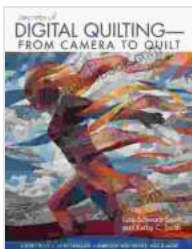

1. Acrylic Pouring

2. Alcohol Ink

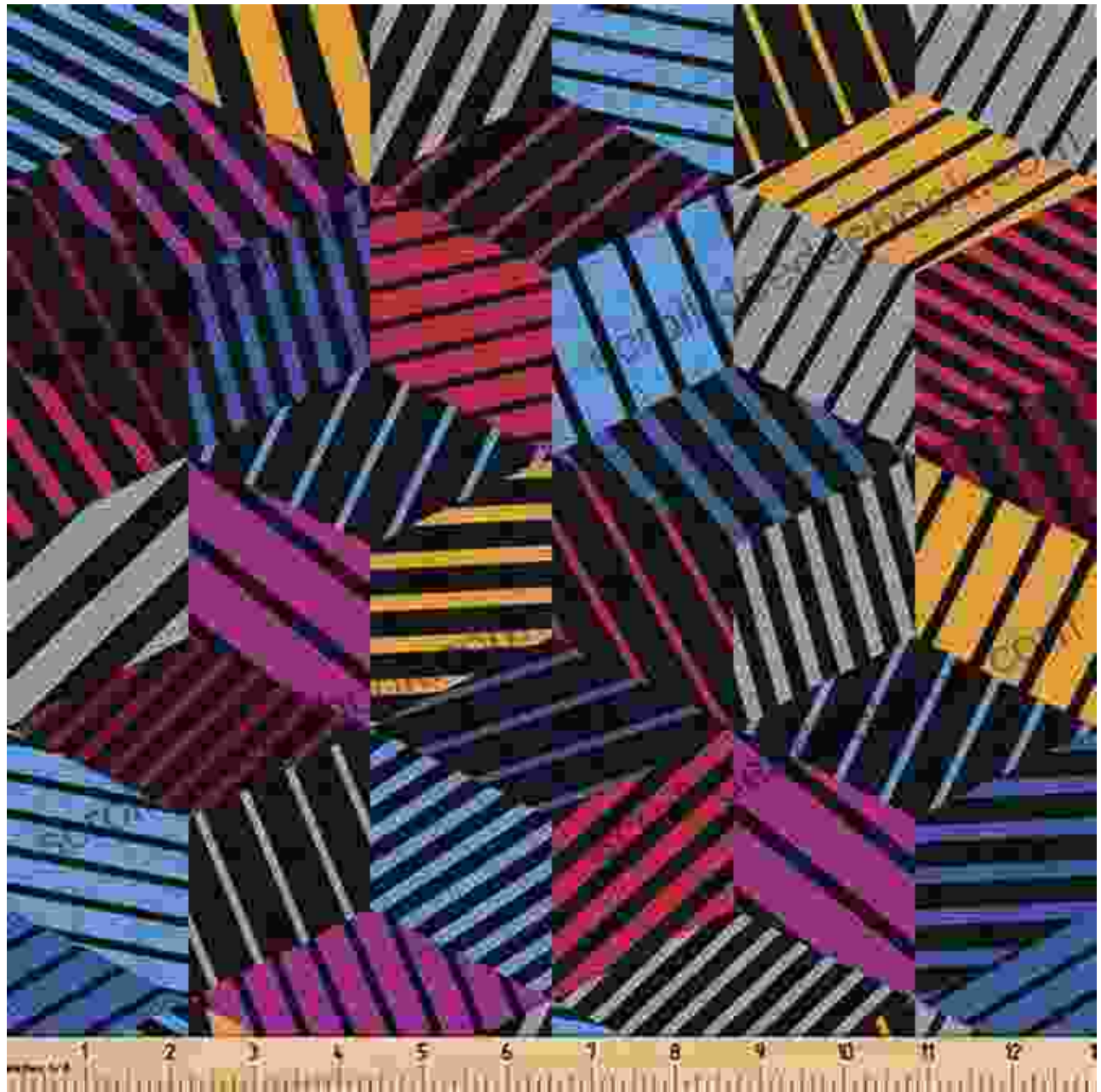
3. Stenciling

6. Gilding

7. Gold Leaf Rubbing

8. Inking

Add color and depth to your projects by applying ink directly to the surface. Use brushes, sponges, or other tools to create a variety of effects, from subtle washes to bold and vibrant designs.

9. Dry Brushing

Create subtle highlights and textures by lightly brushing a dry brush loaded with paint over your project. This technique is particularly effective on three-dimensional surfaces.



10. Glazing

12. Scumbling

13. Trompe L'Oeil

Create the illusion of depth and three-dimensionality on a flat surface using this technique. Use shading, perspective, and other techniques to trick the eye.



14. Collage

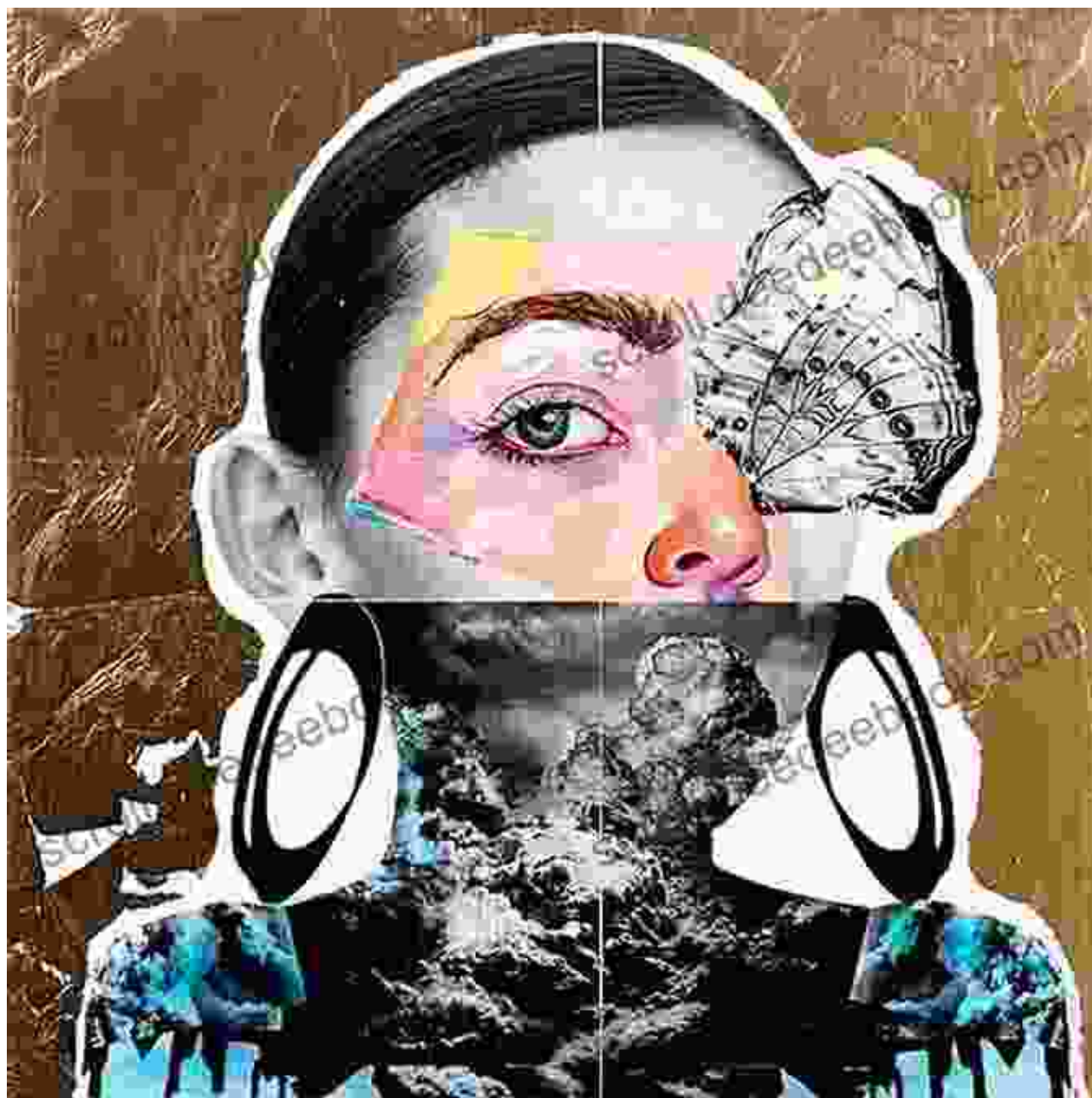
Combine different materials, such as paper, fabric, and found objects, to create a unique and layered artwork. Use glue or other adhesives to attach the elements and create a cohesive composition.

Create bold and intricate designs on fabric using wax and dye. Apply hot wax to the fabric to resist the dye, creating areas of contrasting color and pattern.



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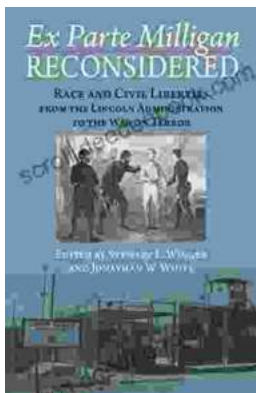
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
