Cricut Materials

The first thing you need to know about Cricut machines is that they can cut a wide variety of materials. These materials include:

* Paper * Cardstock * Vinyl * Fabric * Leather * Wood * Metal * And more!

The type of material you choose will depend on the project you're working on. For example, if you're making a paper card, then you'll need to use paper. If you're making a vinyl decal, then you'll need to use vinyl.

Once you've chosen the right material, you need to load it into your Cricut machine. To do this, simply open the machine's lid and place the material on the cutting mat. Make sure that the material is aligned with the machine's guides.

Once the material is loaded, you can close the machine's lid and press the "Start" button. The machine will then cut the material according to the design you've chosen.

Cricut Tools

In addition to materials, you'll also need to use a variety of tools to create Cricut projects. These tools include:

* Cutting mat * Scoring stylus * Weeding tool * Brayer * Tweezers *
Scissors

The cutting mat is a surface that protects your work surface from the machine's blade. The scoring stylus is used to create creases in paper or cardstock. The weeding tool is used to remove excess material from around your cuts. The brayer is used to smooth out wrinkles in your material. Tweezers are used to pick up small pieces of material. And scissors are used to trim your projects.

Cricut Accessories

In addition to materials and tools, there are also a number of accessories that can make your Cricut experience easier and more enjoyable. These accessories include:

* Bluetooth adapter * Rotary blade * Knife blade * Perforation blade * Debossing tip * Embossing tip * Foiling tip * Washi tape dispenser * Pen adapter * Scoring wheel * Creasing wheel * Perforating wheel * Deb

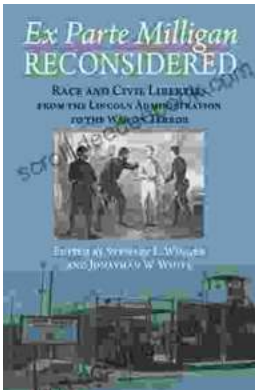
