Release

Try Not to Breathe was released in the United States on August 26, 2016. The film was a critical and commercial success, grossing over \$150 million worldwide against a production budget of \$10 million.

Critical reception

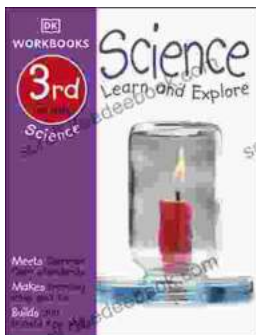

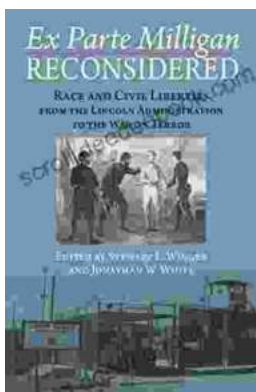
